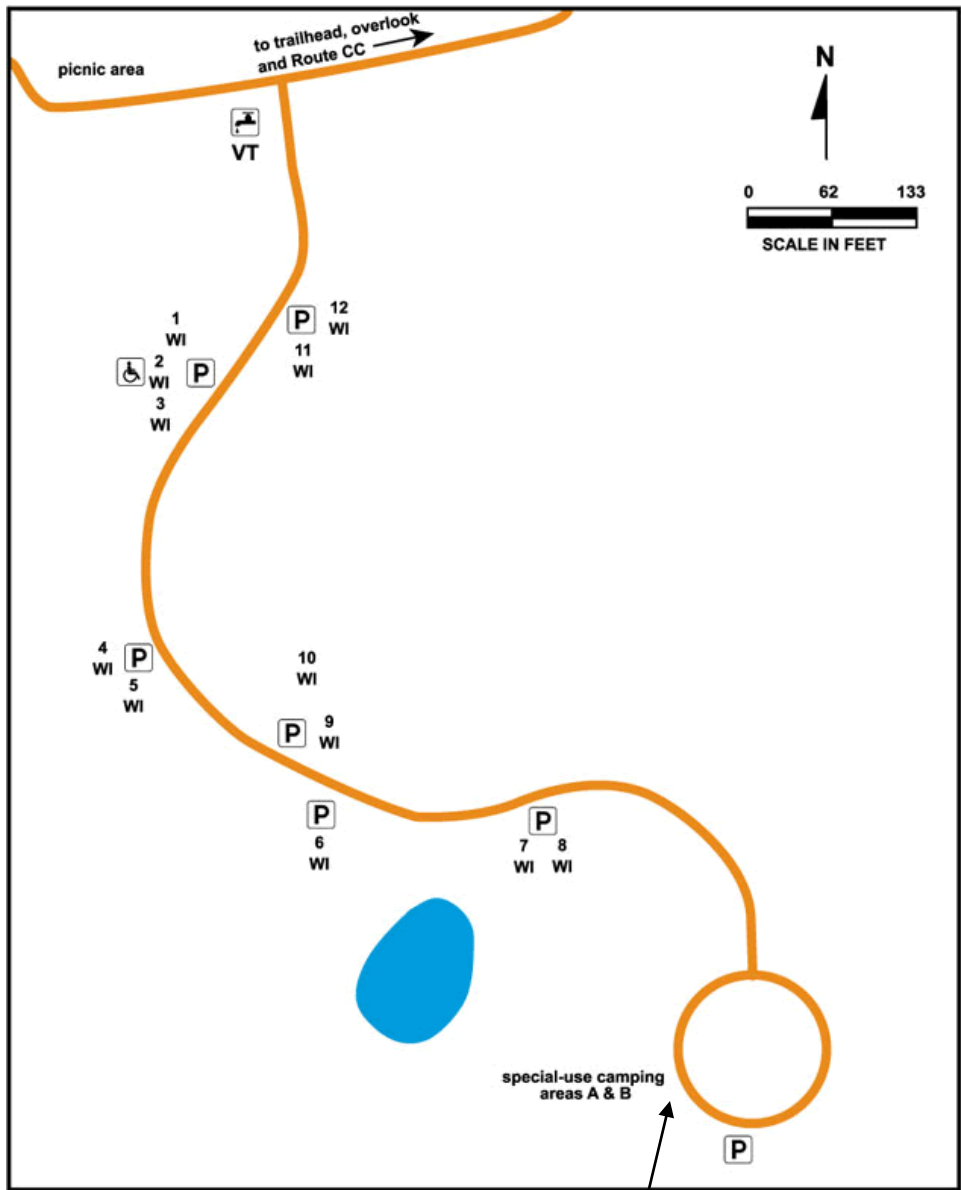

1. Head **southwest** on **Manchester Rd** toward **Cherry Hills Meadows Dr** 0.4 mi
2. At the traffic circle, continue straight to stay on **Manchester Rd** 1.0 mi
3. Turn left onto **MO-109** 7.9 mi
4. Turn left onto **W** 6.4 mi
5. Continue straight onto **Missouri MM** 4.7 mi
6. Merge onto **MO-21 S** via the ramp to **Hillsboro** 12.4 mi
7. Turn left onto **MO-21 S/State Hwy B** 0.5 mi
8. Turn right onto **MO-21 S** 52.6 mi
9. Turn right to stay on **MO-21 S** 9.2 mi
10. Turn right onto **State Hwy CC**
Destination will be on the left 3.2 mi
